


The Jewel of the Prairie

Preserving the Historic Fort Peck Theatre



The Fort Peck Fine Arts Council, a 501(c)(3) organization, is dedicated to the maintenance and preservation of the beautiful Fort Peck Theatre. To accomplish this goal, an **Endowment Fund** was created, and professionally managed through the *Montana Community Foundation*. This has generated **sustainable investment returns** used to fund major restoration projects. Your past gifts to this **Endowment Fund** have been crucial to keeping the theatre looking as wonderful as it did back in 1934.

We have also invested money locally and formed an **Improvement Fund** to expand the scope of where your donations can be applied. **This gives you, the donor, additional choices over how your donation is put to use.** The *Montana Community Foundation Endowment* will continue to support only restoration projects of the theatre. Donations to the **Improvement Fund** may be used for projects considered to be of greatest need. For instance, re-



placement of equipment, maintenance of the set shop, costume shop, rehearsal space and actor housing.

- New stage floor in the summer of 2020
- New roof in the fall of 2021
- Balcony handrails
- Retaining walls and surface grading to improve drainage away from the south side of the theatre


